In the past, we have hosted events in conjunction with Volunteers for Youth, but many of us had not yet met the Executive Director, Susan Worley. It was wonderful to hear this evening about the great work they are doing for and with the youth of Orange County. Volunteers for Youth has a simple mission - to positively integrate young people into the community and help them recognize that they are valuable and important.

Their primary programs are:

- **Mentoring**
- **Community Service & Restitution**
- **Teen Court**

The mentoring program trains and matches volunteers with a youth in need of attention. These young people and their mentors are the ones with whom we have gone bowling and to Durham Bulls games in the past. Susan suggested future shared opportunities with similar outings and Carolyn suggested that we consider the State Fair next year.

The Community Service program oversees young people who have been court ordered to complete an assigned number of volunteer hours. The main goals are to teach children to be responsible for their behavior and provide a learning environment that helps them prepare for future jobs.

In Teen Court, aligned with the Department of Juvenile Justice, young people who have minor violations are brought before a jury of their peers with a real judge presiding. Other young people serve as the lawyers and jurors. This is cost efficient for the justice system since it relies on volunteers. By emphasizing community responsibility and by using creative sentencing strategies, the program focuses on more positive aspects of the process. Teen Court sessions are held in an actual courtroom in the Hillsborough court house.

Their funding comes from multiple sources, including the United Way, towns of Chapel Hill and Carrboro, grants, gifts, and fund raiser events such as their golf outing and 'Scoop Off' ice cream event. We discussed the possibility of actively participating in the 'Scoop Off' this coming year.

Through Volunteers for Youth, caring adults are **making a difference for Orange County children**.
